## **Minutes of an Extraordinary Meeting of the Council held in the Village Hall on Saturday 12th August, 2006**

### **06/07/114 APOLOGIES**

Apologies for absence were submitted by Councillors Bardsley (weekend away), de Bel (day away), Dunn (holiday), Ferrar (weekend away) and Woods (work)

### **06/07/115 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

There were no declarations of interest.

### **06/07/116 MINUTES OF THE LAST ORDINARY MEETING OF THE COUNCIL**

The Minutes of the last ordinary meeting of the Council, held on 17<sup>th</sup> July, 2006, were approved as a correct record.

### **06/07/117 MATTERS ARISING**

There were no matters arising from the Minutes.

### **06/07/118 PUBLIC DISCUSSION**

- (a) District Councillor Simpson referred to the recent presentation of Quality Accreditation certificates to Everton, Gringley on the Hill and Misterton Parish Councils at The White Swan, Drakeholes. It was understood that Bassetlaw District Council had made no financial contribution to the catering arrangements – the cost being kindly met by Nottinghamshire Association of Local Councils.

Whilst the matter was under discussion, the Clerk pointed out that, although Bassetlaw District Council had promised to issue a press release about the presentation, using details provided by him, it had failed to do so, and the Clerk had stepped in and issued a press release the day before the event.

Questions were asked about press coverage, and the Clerk agreed to enquire as to what coverage there was.

- (b) Members of the public present referred to item 7 on the agenda (Future of the Daneshill Household Waste and Recycling Centres), when great concern was expressed at the thought of closure of this important, local facility. The facility at Retford was more remote and difficult to get to, whereas Daneshill was convenient and well used.

One point made about Daneshill was that it was not particularly female friendly; as it could be difficult to haul heavy items of refuse over the sides of the containers.

Members agreed to discuss these points later in the meeting.

- (c) A discussion took place about current home recycling arrangements in Bassetlaw and proposed changes.
- (d) Concern was expressed over the possibility of a one-way traffic system being introduced in Everton. The public was informed that District Councillor Simpson was liaising with the County Council on the issue of a traffic management review, which would include consideration of a one-way system.
- (e) Concern was expressed over speeding on Mattersey Road.

Members were delighted to hear this news, and agreed that a leaflet be produced for delivery by Members to every household in the village, congratulating residents on this success, and encouraging them on to greater things in the competition for the Best of Notts Award.
